<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ It Was set in 1921 by 1919 Act ➤ There are 22 Members <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 15 Lok sbha • 7 Rajya sabha ➤ Settled by single transferable vote – so all participate of all parties ➤ 1 year Tenure ➤ Chairman of committee appointed by speaker ➤ Function – Audit report of CAG on <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Appropriation bill • Public Undertaking • Finance account 	
Estimation Committee	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ In 1921, but 1951 on recommendation of John Mathai ➤ 30 member from Lok Sabha , No member from Rajya Sabha ➤ 1 year Tenure ➤ Function examine – estimates include in Budget & engaged economics in Public expenditure

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ 1964, on reedation of K.M. (Krishna Menon)

- There are 22 Members
 - 15 Lok Sabha
 - 7 Rajya Sabha
- Chairman appointed speaker
- Exam account of Public undertaking

Department Committee

- There are 24 departmental committee, in which 16 department comes under Lok Sabha & 8 under Rajya Sabha
- Each Department have – 31 Members
 - 21 from Lok Sabha
 - 10 from Rajya Sabha

Committee relating day to day business of office house: Separate Committee

- Business Advisory Committee (LS – 15, RS – 11)
- Private Member bill & Resolution (LS – 15, RS – 0)
- Rules committee (LS – 15, RS – 0)
- Committee on absence of member (LS – 15, RS – 0) (if any member absent for 60 days without inform, membership will be ceased)
- Largest Committee of Parliament – estimation court 30 members for LS, No RS on Jordan Mathi in 1921 but formed in 1951.
- Consultative committee of member of Parliament for railway zone is constituted by “Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs”

Note

- Ambedkar elected from West Bengal (WB) presidency
- Cabinet mission provide “federal govt.”.
- Most short fixed at all braita constitutional expenses – Act 1909
- “To uphold and protect sovereignty unity & Integrity” of India – Fundamental Duties
- Member of Constituent Assembly which draft the constitute of India were – elected by LA of various province.
- Constitution of India adopted – 26 Jan 1949.
- M.A. Jinha was not member of constituent assembly of India.
- Constitution has 22 parts.
- Dr. Rajad Parshad became “Food & Agriculture” Minister in 1946
- In case of Formation of state, Parliament can made any law follow in consent of state (Act 253)
- When a bill is referred to joint sitting of both house of Parliament, it has to be passed by – simple majority of members present and voting.
- Parliament of India acquires the power to legislate away item in state list in the national interest if a resolution to that effect is passed by – RS by majority of not less than 2/3 of its member present & voting
- Ant defection law was enacted as early as 1979 in Wes Bengal.
